ADGATE, JOHN HART SR - DEATH DATE - April 23, 1809

COMMENTS

John Hart Adgate was born in Norwich, Connecticut, on Sep. 13, 1759, the son of Thomas and Ruth Leffingwell Adgate, who were married on Jan. 25, 1735. Captain John Hart Adgate served in the Revolutionary War and according to military records he was a surgeon. He married Sarah Fitch, Oct. 10, 1782, probably in New London, Connecticut. His children were John, James, Charles, Ulysses, Sally, Belinda, Caroline and Anna.

He was the first settler in Howland township, coming here in 1799 and purchasing 1600 acres, from Joseph Howland for \$1,600. (Trumbull County Deed Book A, Pg. 61). John Hart Adgate was living in Montville, New London County, Connecticut at that time. The Adgates were the first family to settle in the township and John Hart Adgate was the first Trumbull County Coroner. They built a cabin on what is now S. Pine Street near the old canal. He had a goodly family of children, and an Indian, Benoni Ockrum, lived with him. He bequeathed to his sons, John, James, Charles, Ulysses (William Ulysses) 800 acres from south part of land in Howland Township. This was to be divided equally and shares set aside until they came of age. Division of the property was not completed until 1812 and the estate not settled until 1816 because of numerous debts against it. The remainder of the estate both personal and real after paying debts was to go to his four daughters, Sally Hover, Belinda Leavitt, Caroline and Anna. (Trumbull County Probate Records Books 1 and 2.) Those bearing the name of Adgate who are in business in Warren are John and his son Frank, florists.

Today (2008) members of the Adgate family continue to work in landscaping and in the florist business.

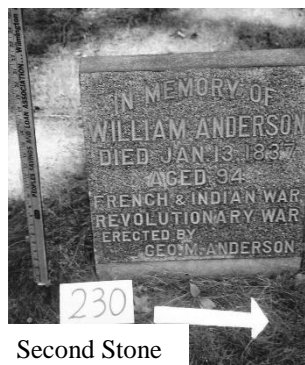

BROOKS, OLIVER - DEATH DATE - January 11, 1849

COMMENTS

Oliver Brooks was born in Cumberland Co., NJ in 1759. He enlisted in the Revolutionary War at Rhodestown, Cumberland Co., NJ in the spring of 1776 probably in March, under Captain William Kelsey; he was discharged after 9 months. When the British took possession of NY, he enlisted at Salem, Salem Co., NJ under Captain Vincent, and served 4 months. Between the two cited times, he was drafted in Cumberland Co.; also after the second enlistment he was drafted, served as a militiaman for more than 33 years. Since the Revolutionary War he has been at sea for about 25 years in the naval activities of Count de Gresse and Rodney, he was taken prisoner by the British.

(Revolutionary War Pension Abstracts-ORPF XXXVIII-31) About 1811 he came to Warren, OH and occupied the old Brooks homestead on South St., between Liberty (now Park Ave.) and Pine St. Oliver Brook's father came to Warren about 1808, he was one of the original stockholders of the Western Reserve Bank owning 20 shares at \$500. OBITUARY

DIED--At his residence in this village, on the evening of the 11th inst., Captain Oliver Brooks, aged nearly 92 years, one of our oldest and most respected citizens. He was among those who entered their country's service at the breaking out of the Revolution, and served on board one or more of the vessels belonging to our then infant navy. He was taken by the British and held as a prisoner of war upwards of three years. He was on board the Admiral ship, (a prisoner) in the celebrated sea fight between Sir Rodney and DeGrasse, French, in the West Indies, and was compelled to assist at one of the guns during the engagement. He followed the seas for a period of thirty years, after which he emigrated to this country, on Nov. 27, 1809, and has resided here up to the time of his death, respected by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance. "Time tolls his careless course. The race of yore, who danced our infancy upon their knee, And told our marveling boyhood legends store Of their strange ventures hap'd by land or sea, How are they blotted from the things that be! How few, all weak and weary of their course, Wait on the verge of dark eternity. Lake stranded wrecks, the tides returning home, Time sweeps them with his ceaseless force.

Born 1757, Revolutionary War, Pvt. NJ State Troops, in battles of Trenton and Princeton; pensioned March 4, 1831. Record in The Western Reserve Historical Society, Cleveland, OH. (Jersey Men in the Revolution, Pg. 193) Died Jan 16, 1834, buried in old cemetery, Warren, OH. Name placed on bronze tablet 1927 by local D. A. R. descendant Isaac Fithian, Warren OH. All of his property was willed to nieces and nephews. (The Official Roster of the Soldiers of the America Revolution Buried in the State of Ohio Vol. 1, Pg. 141) (Correction is published in The Official Roster III Soldiers of the American Revolution who Lived in the State of Ohio, Pg. 129)

Rebecca who married Mathew Scott and is listed in some of the records as his daughter is actually his niece, the daughter of Grover his brother. The following is an abstract of Isaac Fithian's will (Trumbull County Probate Records, Vol. 7, Pg. 184-185)

Will of Isaac Fithian of the town of Warren, at the time advanced in years. Just debts to be paid. To my nephew Isaac Fithian Reeves \$2500, in money and certain (named) personal items.

To my nephew Benjamin Fithian and his two sons, Isaac Fithian and Judd Fithian, \$300 to be divided between them, equally.

To my nephews David Fithian and Isaac Fithian of Centerville (State not given) the sons of Israel Fithian \$400 to be equally divided between them.

To Mathew Scott formerly husband of Rebecca Scott, deceased, who was the daughter of Grover Fithian and to Hannah McKinley, daughter of Israel Fithian the sum of ~~

OBITUARY

Western Reserve Chronicle - Jan. 23, 1834

DIED--Near this village, on the 16th inst., Mr. Isaac Fithian, aged 76 years, 10 months, and 26 days. The deceased was a soldier of the Revolution, and entered the army before the Declaration of Independence and continued in the service till near the close of the war. He was present at the battles of Trenton and Princeton.

Born 1735, a Revolutionary soldier from NJ, settled here in 1799, About 1800 he donated the land on which the old cemetery now stands. (Trumbull Co.OH, Deed Book 31, Pgs. 130-131) [This deed appears to legalize what had been done for over thirty years]

Henry Lane married Mrs. Mary Jones who had an adult son, Edward Jones, who came with them to Trumbull Co., Ohio. Children named in a partition of land suit, order uncertain:

(1) Henry, died Mar 21, 1845, age 78, in Warren, OH, married 1st, Elsie, died May 23, 1841, age 65y 7m 22d, daughter of William and Britta Morgan of Washington Co., PA, married 2nd, Jul 5, 1842 Mrs. Statira Coales Woodford, died Apr ? 1845, widow of Isaac Woodford (his estate descends to his brothers, sisters and widow);

(2) Asa, died in PA, married Cata, a resident of Rostraver Twp, Westmoreland Co., PA;

(3) Catherine died Dec 9, 1863, age 77 yrs, married 1st Jun 30 1803 to Jonathan Church, married 2nd Mar 16, 1819 to John Tait who died Feb 17, 1868, age 79 yrs.;

(4) Jenny married Charles Dailey;

(5) Hannah married William Rutan of Champion

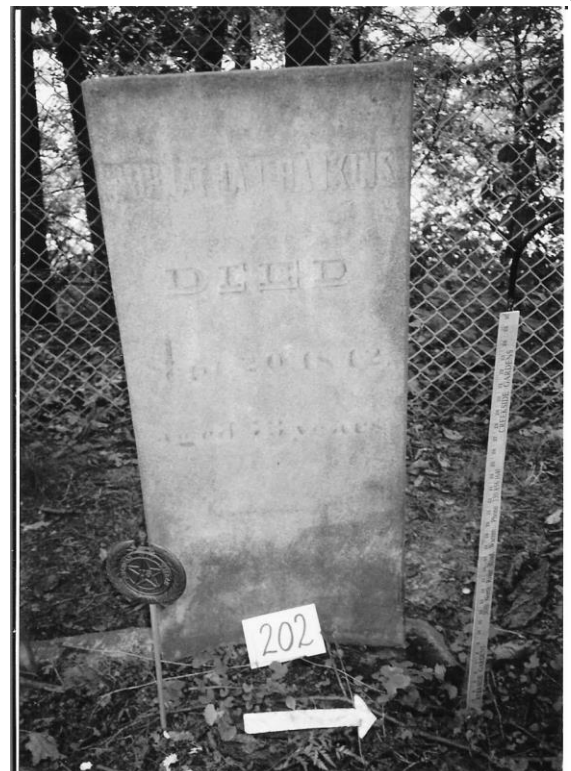

He was also at Princeton, Brandywine, and in several skirmishes, in one of which he was the captor of a British baggage wagon, horses, driver and all, and succeeded in getting them safely to camp. Government awarded him a pension in after life. But more than this, he was a Christian, and that too from early youth, and during a long life, ever practiced those principles of the Bible which endeared him to his relatives and acquaintances, and showed that his religion was on of principle and not merely form.

Calvin Austin was probably in Warren, OH in 1800, coming from Sheffield, CT. There was no lack of patriotic enthusiastic demonstration at Warren on July 4th, 1800. Calvin Austin was present to participate. He was a prominent man, one of the first justices of the peace. He resided on the west side of Main Street, between South St. & Market St. (#38, Iddings 1816 map) His sons Seymour and Calvin were prominent merchants. He was also associate judge of the common pleas court 1802-1807. In 1804 he was elected the first treasurer of the Old Erie Lodge #3, free and accepted Masons (granted a charter on Oct. 19, 1803), an emblem of the Masonic Lodge is engraved on his monument. He served in the War of 1812. In 1813 he was elected on the Board of Directors of the Western Reserve bank, he owned 200 shares of Western Reserve bank, value \$5000. His wife Martha, also of Sheffield CT. died Nov. 13, 1850 in Pittsburgh. (History of Trumbull & Mahoning Co., Vol. I)

Western Reserve Chronicle - Oct. 7, 1819

DIED--Instantaneously, on Saturday evening last, CALVIN AUSTIN, Esq. of this place, in the 58th year of his age. He was one of the original proprietors, one of the earliest settlers, one of the fathers of the Connecticut Western Reserve. His frank hospitality, and his warm-hearted liberality, made every stranger his acquaintance, and endeared him alike to them, and to his neighborhood. While such traits of character are respected, and the services the deceased has rendered to this section of the country are recollected, the memory of Judge Austin will be fondly cherished by all who knew him personally or by reputation.

Oct. 28, 1819 DIED--The following obituary notice states a circumstance, which, although it occurred in this place, was unknown to us until it appeared in the Ohio Spectator. It would afford us more pleasure to contradict than to confirm; but we find it too true. The paragraph is republished at the request of several respectable gentlemen.

From the Ohio Spectator [Communicated]

DIED--Suddenly, on Saturday, the 2nd ult., Calvin Austin, Esq. of Warren, Trumbull County. His remains were borne by his Masonic brethren, on Monday, to the Court House, attended by a numerous collection of his acquaintance, among whom was recognized with pleasure, many who commenced the settlement of the country with the deceased. An appropriate discourse was delivered by the Rev. Mr. Stone, to an attentive audience; after which the corpse was interred by the brethren, agreeably to the ancient usages of the craft. To the discredit of the order, and afflicting to the feelings of the mourners and brethren not actors, two of the brethren, immediately after the last sad office of interment was performed, prayed out a capias, in direct violation of every Masonic, humane principle, against one of the sons of the deceased, a Mason, who attended from an adjoining county, to discharge this last filial duty. To the honor of civilization, such instances are rarely recorded; and the brethren deeply lament, that those who profess to have been enlightened by the virtues of the order, should be callous to every generous emotion.

DIED-- In Weathersfield, Trumbull Co., Ohio, Sept. 17th, 1858, Mr. JAMES DUNLAP, in the 78th year of his age. Mr. Dunlap was born in Berks, Co. Penn., he resided a short time in Washington Co., Penn, and in 1800 he moved to Poland, Mahoning Co., Ohio, where he resided about four years when he settled in Weathersfield, Trumbull Co., Ohio, since which time he has been a permanent resident of that place. The deceased had been a member of the Presbyterian Church in Warren 33 years, and for the last 20 years had held the office of an Elder in the Church. Of amiable disposition, unaffected piety, wise in counsel, and deeply interested in the prosperity of the Redeemer's Kingdom, his loss will be sensibly felt, not only by his friends, but by the Church and the community. Some two years since, he was prostrated by a paralytic stroke, and continued gradually to decline till his death. He died as he had lived, at peace with God, and all mankind. The voice of his Master is. - "Well done thou good and faithful servant, enter then into the joy of the Lord."

COMMENTS

Born in New Haven, Connecticut, Aug. 23, 1777. He was the son of Pierpont and Frances Ogden Edwards. His birth occurring shortly after the battle of Bennington, Vermont, his father gave the name of General Stark, the hero of that battle and on old friend, to his son. He graduated at Princeton college, New Jersey, in 1796, studied law with his father, who was a distinguished lawyer, attended the lectures of Judge Tappan Reeve, at the celebrated Litchfield Law School, and was admitted to the bar at New Haven in the spring of 1799. Shortly after he left New Haven for Warren, Ohio, where he arrived in June of that year. He was probably the first lawyer of the Western Reserve & the first Trumbull County recorder in 1800 - 1813. In March 1811 he was commissioned Colonel of the 2nd regiment, 3rd brigade, 4th division, Ohio militia. On the receipt of the news of the surrender of General Hull, at Detroit, in August, 1812, he, with others made strenuous endeavors to put the country in a state of defense, a general and great alarm being felt, as by that surrender the whole country lay exposed to the dangers of incursions by the British and Indians. He marched with a portion of his regiment to Cleveland. After being there for a period, new arrangements were made by the military authorities, and his services as an officer being no longer required, he returned to Warren. He was elected Representative in Congress, from the 6th district, in October 1812. In January 1813, along with George Parsons and William Bell he left Warren on a journey to Put-in-Bay to look after the property he owned there. When at Lower Sandusky, a thaw coming on, they thought it best to return home. He got wet, was taken ill on the road, and died on February 22, 1813. (History of Trumbull & Mahoning Counties, Ohio, Vol. I, Pg. 182a) John Stark had a house on the north side of South St. between what is now Pine St. and Vine St., it later became the Thomas D. Webb house. (#26, Iddings 1816 map) 2 Stones.

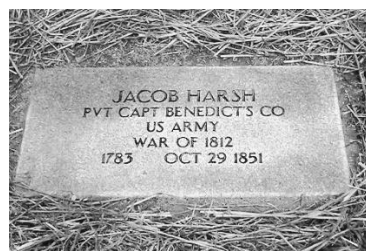

Jacob Harsh was born 1783, in Lancaster Co., PA, and he came to Trumbull Co., OH in 1803, settling in Warren. In 1828 the third building going west on Market St. was Jacob Harsh's blacksmith shop with it's blazing forge and noisy anvil. In the last mentioned year, he removed to Ohio and was admitted to the bar, in this place, where he has since, constantly resided. By means of his industry, integrity, and affability, united with talents of a respectable order, Gen. Stone, soon after his admission to the bar, became a popular advocate, and established himself in the confidence of his fellow citizens. In the year 1826, he was elected a member of the general assembly of this state, and acquitted himself in the office in such a manner as to secure the respect of his associates, in that honorable body. For the last seven of eight years, he has prosecuted the pleas of the commonwealth for this county, in addition to the discharge of other and more laborious duties, appertaining to his professional calling, when engaged in civil causes. The proceedings of the Bar-meeting, called the occasion of his decease, and which are subjoined, * will shew in what light his professional conduct was viewed by those most capable of indulging correctly. The deceased has left a widow and two children, besides a great circle of friends: "To the latter, his death is a severe affliction; but to the former, to whom his life was pre-eminently precious, it is an unspeakable loss."--[Communicated]

HORRIBLE TRAGEDY ! ATTEMPT AT MURDER & SUICIDE A Man Stabs his Wife Seven Times and then Kills himself ! WHISKY THE CAUSE !

South Warren, on last Friday evening about half-past six o'clock, was the scene of the most bloody, premeditated and desperate tragedy that we remember having ever occurred in the history of the town or county; the reports of which sent a thrill of horror through the minds of our citizens and caused intense excitement. The report was to the effect that Charles Frease, a young man living near Liberty Street, south of the canal, had severely, if not fatally, stabbed his wife and then made good his escape in the darkness of the evening. The wildest rumors were afloat concerning the affair, and telegrams were at once sent in all directions, and arrangements made to pursue the would be murderer, s soon as daylight came and any trace of him could be discovered, when search for the guilty man was abandoned for the night. On visiting the house, Mrs. Frease was found to be in very critical condition, having been stabbed some seven or eight times in the back. side and arms -- on of the arms being frightfully gashed near the shoulder and almost severed from the body. One of the wounds in the back it was feared had penetrated the left lung. The Doctors Woods were soon at the house, and rendered the injured woman every aid in their power, and after probing and dressing the wounds, pronounced the very serious, but not necessarily fatal. Soon after daylight, Mr. William Pepper, a brother of Mrs. Frease, found the lifeless body of the would be murdered lying in a small enclosure a few rods in rear of the house where he had the night before made the murderous assault upon his wife. Supposing he had deprived her of life, he went out the back door of the house and with the same weapon deliberately took his own life. There were eight distinct stabs on his left breast, one of which penetrated to the region of the heart, and was sufficient to produce death. The deceased was a native of this place, we believe about 30 years of age, and entered the army as a private in Co. "C," 19th O.V.I in the three months' service. When the regiment re-organized for three years, he was again found serving in the ranks of his old Company, and when the regiment veteranized he returned to the field and continued in service until the organization mustered out. He is represented as having been a brave and good soldier by those who served with him, his greatest fault being an inclination for gambling. DIED--The family of MARTIN RAWDON, in this place, received a dispatch on last Sunday informing them that Mr. Rawdon had been killed on the preceding day, on the Toledo railroad, on which he was employed as a brakeman. In this capacity he was at work on the top of freight car, and in passing under a bridge, he was struck by the timbers, knocked off the car and killed. His remains were brought to this place on Monday for interment. The funeral services were held on Tuesday at the Methodist church. The deceased leaves a wife and several children.

On going home he went to sleep near a broken window and caught cold, which settled upon his lungs, and was the ultimate cause of his death. Ben was 52 years old, and came to this city when 22 years of age, started a barber shop and many remember him as "Gen'l Benj. Scott, tonsorial artist." He leaves a wife and eight children. On Sunday his remains were interred in the old cemetery, the funeral being quite largely attended.
